## Good Soil

Greetings from the Leaf Pile capital of the world!

This past week I finally was able to finish up the arduous task of picking up what felt like 78 million leaves in my yard. Between my house and my neighbors, there are three huge trees that are on my plot of land. Often I find myself worrying

about the effect it has on his yard and how much work it will cause them, so almost every day I'm blowing leaves from my trees out of their yard, in hopes they won't have to.

Now I have freedom from leaves, for another year....Sigh.

During this year's

hauling my oldest son, Nixon, helped me bring most of them to the backyard where there are woods. We have come up with a system of dragging them on a large tarp and depositing them there. He said something that warmed my heart, "Dad, won't these leaves going into the woods just pile up and make it hard for our other neighbor to deal with?"

Thinking of a way to answer, I did some research on what happens to the leaves that are left. These dead leaves may seem a worthless nuisance, but in reality they protect and feed the forest! Litter is often thought as being worthless trash, but leaf litter is unexpectedly valuable! In fact, forest ecologists use leaf litter as a measure of productivity. Why the lesson on ecology? Where am I going with this?

Most of us want to put the past behind us, we don't want to think of our failures, we don't want to think about the things that didn't work out. Like the leaves falling off the tree, they may be dead but the tree is very much alive.

Pondering this, I thought, why don't I look at the leaves falling off the trees as the issues and problems of life?

There will be new issues every season, just like there are new leaves every Spring. When the old issues of life eventually die off, there will be new ones that will bud. If we take this line of thinking and apply it to

> our own lives and the issues of our life, then the "leaves" that "litter" our life (our problems and issues) are actually valuable! We don't just sweep them away and go onto the next season, no, we use what we learned about ourselves and especially what we learned about God!

Hebrews 13:8 tells us that Jesus Christ is the same yesterday, and today, and forever. Do you hear

that?!? He is the same yesterday, today and tomorrow: that means if He was with me through all those previous tough times, then He will be with me in the future ones. This is our leaf litter, our "issues of life," becoming valuable to us! Most wisdom comes from previous experience!

We want to be wise, but do we still "want to be wise" when we fully understand how we get there?

Like a senior boxer that has twenty plus fights under his belt, his experience has given him the understanding of every circumstance in the ring, but how did he get there? By taking a lot of punches! The leaf litter or our previous experiences in our lives are not junk, it's not to be thrown away. It is to be used to enrich our own life's soil for our future decisions and attitudes.
